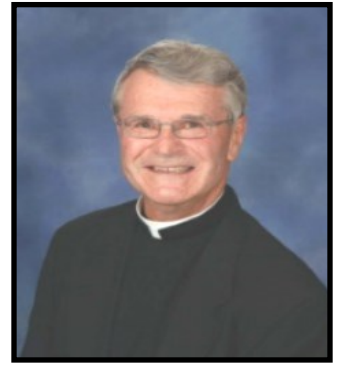

Third Sunday of Easter

The Archdiocese of St. Louis is hosting a Maafa Profession on *Saturday, June 18, 9 a.m. to 12 p.m.* A Maafa—Kiswahili for “Great Disaster” - is a traditional procession memorializing lives lost during the Middle Passage of the Atlantic slave trade. The Procession will be led by Archbishop Mitchell Rozanski and other faith leaders. It will begin with a prayer service at the Old Cathedral, 209 Walnut Street and journey to historic downtown sites related to the slave trade. Additional details will be provided in May.
