




The More You Know: An Informed Catholic is a Well-formed Catholic

To gain a deeper understanding of the topic, follow the ACTS (Adoration, Contrition, Thanksgiving, Supplication) process and consider deeper reading and thinking about each topic using the appropriate, associated references. This is one small effort for Catholic Evangelization and Education. Always remind yourself of the Holy Trinity and of Christ's Redemption of our souls.

The sacraments are ties instituted by Christ to confer the grace they signify. The Sacraments of healing are: *Matrimony*-Marriage is God's design for humanity and a mystery mirroring Christ's love for the Church. *Holy Orders* is the sacrament through which Christ continues the ministry He entrusted to His apostles. It includes the three degrees of a) *Episcopacy* (bishops), b) *Presbyterate* (priests) and c) *Diaconate* (deacons).

<u>Reminder to Parents</u>: *ALL Kids Need Acceptance*. How would you feel if in the eyes of those you care about most – you never make the grade, are never good enough, and everything you do falls short of their expectations?

<u>Try this</u>: Tell your child (ren) today: "I think you're wonderful, just as you are. Even when you make mistakes or do foolish things, I still love and accept you unconditionally, without any if's, and's, or but's, without any strings or conditions attached."
